

# BUSINESS LAW GRADUATE CERTIFICATE

Must be admitted to the Business Law Certificate.

The admission requirements are as follows: (1) must be an enrolled JD student at the University of Idaho College of Law; (2) must have taken and earned a B- or higher in LAW 9190 Business Associations (4 credits); (3) must have taken and earned a B- or higher in LAW 9300 Federal Income Taxation (3 or 4 credits); and (4) must have taken and earned a B- or higher in either LAW 9240 Sales (3 credits) or LAW 9250 Property Security (3 credits).

Must achieve a B- or higher in all additional course requirements (O-10-b (<https://catalog.uidaho.edu/general-requirements-academic-procedures/o-miscellaneous/>)).

Students will master the fundamentals of taxation including understanding and learning about the United States Tax Code.

Students will master the fundamentals of commercial law, including learning how to read and interpret important provisions of the Uniform Commercial Code.

Students will gain additional knowledge about business-related fields of interest to them.

Students will gain competence in skills-based business law either through a course or externship.

Students will improve their writing and overall business law comprehension through focusing their upper division writing requirement on a business law topic of their choosing.
